In the session Sergeant Doug Bowles who is stationed at South Melbourne will talk about the real issues of violence in our society especially in relation to family violence and alcohol related issues. This is an opportunity to find out more about an often hidden side of our community and will be the first session in a series looking at the Christian response to these aspects of life. As much as we might like to think it ‘doesn’t happen in our community’ it is important to consider these realities and how we as a community and church should respond. As a society we should consider the place of Christian values of forgiveness and reconciliation and explore our role in building a culture of nonviolence in our neighborhood.
